The following lists of library books have been provided so that you can gather the books ahead of time from your classroom, school/local library, or have a librarian do that for you as you are preparing for each chapter. The books recommended should be available in public libraries and many school libraries, as all were in print at the time of our publication. These lists of library books might be good suggestions for your school librarian or parent volunteer groups, such as a PTO/PTA, to purchase if you have the opportunity to suggest books to add to the school library. These books allow students to see and apply mathematics in a variety of cross-curricular settings.
